- Please leave weapons in your vehicle until called for during class- we will do a safety brief first. There is a designated weapon clearing area. Do not load or unload in the parking lot.
- Safety is paramount. Anyone causing a negligent discharge will be immediately without recourse. Persons with recurrent gun handling safety errors may have to complete the course with an empty firearm.

Ammo Count:
